1. Introduction

2. Procedure & Detail

- Ensure all teaching and coaching staff are aware of normal and emergency operating procedures for all pools they work in.
- In the event of an accident or emergency at the pool, the following procedure is to be followed:
 - Inform the most senior coach in attendance immediately
 - Ensure everyone is safe
 - Inform the pool staff who will assess the situation and follow their emergency plans
 - The swimmers parents must be contacted immediately.
- All accidents report must be completed on every occasion
- All incidents must be recorded in the Club Accident / Incident books held by the Club Secretary.
- The Committee is to be made aware of any serious accident or injury.
- Serious incidents which could possibly give rise to threat of legal action must be reported to ASA insurance brokers immediately.
- Do not accept liability for any incident as it occurs as this is in a breach of our insurance policy.
- The most senior coach at poolside is to be responsible for implementing emergency plans as set out within each pool Emergency Operating Procedure.

3. Monitoring & Review

We will review the operation and outcomes of this policy at least every 24 months
